
ANNUAL REPORT 2024


BUILDING GRASSROOTS POWER **OUR HISTORY**

The Audre Lorde Project was created to support the growing community of LGBTSTGNC People of Color in New York City 30 years ago. There was a need for a central space for our communities to gather, envision, prioritize, and advocate for the wellbeing of those most marginalized within our communities. Within a few years of our founding, it became clear that we needed to address the impacts of living in a volatile political climate through building grassroots power in order to address and improve the material conditions of the lives of LGBTSTGNC People of Color. The lives of our communities have improved, and there's still much to be done to realize our vision of collective liberation.



The community organizing of the Audre Lorde Project is shaped by the direct experiences of LGBTSTGNC People of Color in New York City and the political conditions in which we live within. We are part of a long political lineage of Black Feminist struggle that is informed by the recognition that our survival and existence are interconnected with the lives of all oppressed people. It is imperative that we evolve, adapt, and create new forms of expression, thought, and ways of being. Looking ahead, we will have to develop clear and direct strategies to address increasingly authoritarian governance systems. We are committed to challenging city, state, and national public officials and holding them accountable in serving the public good. We will continue to build the collective capacity of local, U.S.-based, and International liberation movements.

A proud Black transgender woman and the daughter of Jamaican immigrants, Sanai draws upon her lived experiences and unwavering belief in collective care to champion causes that uplift social justice and equity. Her professional journey is rooted in a deep understanding of the challenges faced by the communities she serves because she is an integral part of these communities, working alongside them for a better future.

Sanai's fundraising expertise spans a diverse array of organizations, including The Trevor Project, Cool Culture, TheaterWorkUSA, the Drug Policy Alliance, and WNET. Through her work, she has cultivated meaningful relationships with donors, crafted powerful narratives, and mobilized resources to support arts accessibility, LGBTQIA+ advocacy, and educational equity. Whether securing transformational gifts or hosting events that bring people together, Sanai approaches fundraising as a collaborative act of love.







In building on the Audre Lorde Project's political legacy and strengthening our impact in the community, we held a 9-month Strategic Planning process outlining our priorities for the next three years.

By the end of 2027:

- We will be a vibrant community organizing center for the politicization, radicalization, and empowerment of LGBTSTGNC People of Color throughout New York City. We are invested in building capacity for our base to organize for collective transformation.
- We will have one organization-wide campaign that improves the lives/conditions and builds the collective power of LGBTSTGNC People of Color in NYC.
- We will grow and expand our membership by 200 members. We will prioritize the leadership development and political education of our members.
- We will develop public communications that keep our base and community informed about work. We will support LGBTSTGNC in engaging in digital and in-person organizing.
- We will develop a multi-tiered fundraising plan with a focus on increasing our grassroots fundraising and implement this plan annually.
- We will increase the size of our Board of Directors and hire New Executive Leadership.
